## Sound Your Horn



### Did galvanizing truly save steel?

I love the "Vintage Ad" section of *Old Cars*, because the ads bring back so many good and, sometimes, bad memories. The 1981 AMC "Vintage Ad" in the Aug. 15 issue featured the AMC generation that used galvanized steel and it got me thinking. I remember when galvanized steel was first promoted and used by AMC. I wonder, has anybody gone to automotive salvage yards to determine if the galvanizing was effective over the years? In other words, did it work? And also, it wasn't long after the use of galvanized steel that there were rumors that paint on these cars would simply fall off. Is there any truth to that?

Editor's note: Being located in the salt belt state of Wisconsin, which was also AMC's home state, the Old Cars staff is qualified to offer at least some insight to the protective qualities of galvanized steel. In our regular travels to local salvage yards, we see many late-1970s and early-1980s AMC vehicles, and those AMCs in the salvage yard do seem to have less body rust than their contemporaries. To add some more data to the galvanized steel question, a former Old Cars staffer has a 1989 Cadillac Eldorado with a galvanized-steel body. The Cadillac's paint lifted in a few areas, and several years after the steel beneath the paint was exposed, the exposed areas became cloudy white, but surface rust had not yet formed. Readers, do you have additional experience?

### Remembering Reeves Callaway

I wanted to thank Angelo Van Bogart for his "Hop in" column in memory of Reeves Callaway; it was a touching tribute to a man many of us worked with and loved. I had the honor to serve as Chairman and CEO of Kaman Corp., and Reeves was a member of our board of directors for more than 20 years, retiring just in April of this year.

Many knew Reeves for his extraordinary career as a racer, "tuner," designer and manufacturer of truly extraordinary automobiles. Oh, and he ran a pretty good race team as well. However, fewer got the chance to see how his insights helped guide companies to be better and to challenge themselves to develop and adapt leading technologies into their products. From his engineering expertise in advanced composites, to aerodynamics, to unmanned flight and artificial intelligence, Reeves was a true visionary in every sense of the word.

And, finally, the weekend before his passing, we exchanged text messages to set a plan to get together. However, 95 percent of the message was about his family! Again, not surprising if you knew Reeves.

### Flint celebrates 70 years of the Corvette

FLINT, Mich. – On Wednesday, June 28, the city of Flint, Mich., honored the 70th anniversary of the Chevrolet Corvette. The special ceremony was two days before the actual 70th anniversary of the when the very first Corvette rolled off the sports car's first assembly line there on June 30, because the Flint Assembly plant was preparing to shut down that day for a changeover.

According to ABC 12 News of Flint, the ceremony was hosted by Back to the Bricks organizers, General Motors' Flint Assembly plant leaders, UAW union members and local leaders. Many members of Flint's five Corvette clubs also participated. Part of a large display at the ceremony showed historic images of the first 1953 Corvette driving off a Flint assembly plant on the city's Van Slyke Road, near GM's current Flint Assembly Plant, where the first Corvettes were essentially hand-built. Each 1953 Corvette had a Polo White-painted fiberglass body with a red interior; only 300 were built the model's inaugural model year.

For 1954, the process of building a Corvette became

more production-friendly, thanks to what was learned at the Flint assembly plant, and Corvette manufacture was moved to a General Motors assembly plant in St. Louis.

The 70th anniversary Corvette festivities continued on June 30 at the newly relocated site of the GM Heritage Center in Grand Blanc, Mich.



Yes, even some Duesenbergs were wrecked back in the day, but don't worry — it's not as bad as it looks and this car was repaired to drive another day.

The photo comes from a 1938 pamphlet from one-time gasoline producer Tydol that promotes safe driving. The original caption for this photo reads, "Mows down light post! This high-powered sports coupe sheared through a light post. When extricated from wreckage, driver found to have fractured skull and lacerations all over body." We don't know the identity of that driver, but the Duesenberg Model J is actually a convertible coupe re-bodied by Bohman & Schwartz in 1933 for movie director Roy del Ruth, according to Fred Roe's book "Duesenberg: The Pursuit of Perfection." This car survives in concours condition.



### Eye candy does the job for Olds, Jeepster magazines


f pictures raise the circulation of magazines (as so often is the case), then there is little doubt that two recent club publications are prime examples of how to grab the attention of hobbyists.

# Vintage ad of the week

ord Motor Co. collaborated with the New England Fish Co. (NEFCO) and appliance manufacturer West Bend to underwrite the expenses for a contest that ran from late July through September 1964.

As depicted in magazine ads, the contest's grand prize was a pair of Ford Mustangs; the "elegant" hardtop and the "spirited" convertible. Each came with the "racy" 164-hp V-8, Cruise-O-Matic transmission, radio, heater and whitewall tires.

Lesser prizes included West Bend-brand electric coffee makers, electric kabobs, electric broilers and metal ice buckets.

Contest rules specified that all federal, state and local taxes were to be paid by winning participants.

Another statement in the ad proudly flaunted how Mustang was the first automobile to receive the Tiffany Award for Excellence in American Design.

To enter, contestants wrote their name and address on the backside of labels for Alaska Pink Beauty Pink Salmon or Pillar Rock Red Salmon (or a plain sheet of paper) and mailed them to NEFCO in the Alaska Building of Seattle, Wash. The contest was open to residents of all states except Hawaii and, oddly enough, Alaska.





Regarding Ron Patyski's problems with the intermittent wipers on his 1993 F150 (Q&A July 1), [he should] get a hold of the wiring diagrams for his vehicle to trace this issue down. As you stated, poor or broken grounds can cause a myriad of issues. Looking at the diagrams that I have available, the wipers and headlights use the same main grounds, G100, G101 and G201. I also see some splices in the wiring diagram that may have broken or corroded and could cause problems.

G100 is located at the LH front of the engine compartment, top of upper radiator support. G101 is located at the RH front of the engine compartment, in front of the fender apron. G201 is located behind the bottom of the LH cowl panel.

I would first recommend removal of the fasteners that hold these grounds and cleaning the eyelet, the fastener and where the ground mounts. If that doesn't help, then consult a wiring diagram to understand where power is applied and where grounds are applied.

Thrown into the mix is a solid-state "black box" which is the wiper control module. Having a wiring diagram and determining if the module has everything it needs (power/grounds/switch actuation) may help determine if the module is bad.

A Thanks, John. Your experience and insight are always helpful.

There was mention of water injection [recently], and it brought to mind a few stories. The first is about the 1953 Plymouth convertible I had in high school and college. Top speed was 80 mph, unless it was raining or just afterwards, when the air and roads were still wet. Then it would do 85 mph.



I had also been told that World War II airplanes would use water injection on takeoff for more power. The third story is from a friend, whom I had met at my first job out of college. During WWII, it was hard to find a good car, so he would buy a Studebaker that was burning oil and put a fuel [water] injector on it. The steam from the water would break up the carbon and it would stop burning oil. He would sell it for a profit and then purchase another. On another car, he put in another fuel tank for kerosene. With the water, he could run the kerosene without smoking and also receive better power than just straight kerosene. I don't know fuel prices back then, but I believe kerosene was less than half the price of gas and more readily available, as gas was rationed.

A Thanks for sharing your experience and stories. Water injection, both intentional and happenstance, really is a thing.

Any advice what kind of complete floor pan I can purchase for my Classic 770? Thanks.

A I believe you're referring to a 1965 or '66 AMC Rambler model. It is built, I'm quite sure, as a unibody structure, so the floor is part of the structure. I gather yours is rusted or otherwise unusable so, short of finding someone to craft one out of sheet metal, I'm unsure what to suggest. AMC enthusiasts, any hints? A good, usable pan is most likely to exist in a southern state. This photo, not of Albert's car but of another Classic 770, may help junkyard scouts in searching. Thanks to my friend and colleague John Katz for the image.




there was a time when the valuable Duesenberg

Model J was daily transportation and subjected to the toils of everyday use. After the cars lost their shine, most were sold for a small fraction of their original purchase prices of about \$13,500 to \$25,000. For \$500 or \$1,000, buyers during the late 1930s through the 1950s could scoop up used Duesenbergs in classified ads and on used car lots, although at those prices, they generally didn't remain for sale long.

The following images show several Model J Duesenbergs when they could be spotted on streets, in parking lots, on used car lots and in owners' driveways rather than on concours greens. Thanks goes out to the Ferrara family for supplying these images, and to Auburn Cord Duesenberg historian and restoration consultant Randy Ema for identifying several of the cars.



Pictured for sale on the Mayfield Car Co. lot at 100 North Hollywood Way in Burbank, Calif., in the early 1950s (*Old Cars*, May 15, 2023) is the Rollston convertible victoria on the long wheelbase with engine J-337. The windshield reads "32 DUES 2 dr Conv" but alas, no price is listed to encourage time travel. Note the 1937 Cord 812 Phaeton to its driver's side and the Classic Lincoln behind it.




Another Duesenberg Rollston convertible victoria, yet very different than the more standard example above. Making this Rollston convertible victoria unique from the others are its angled front door line that nearly matches the windshield rake, its lower rocker sills and its wider body that causes the rear fenders to be narrower than standard where they meet the body coachwork. This Duesenberg Model J has engine J-538 and rides on chassis 2566, and is pictured here after years and miles turned it into a used car (note the poor condition of the spare tire). This car survives and was, for at least a time, painted red and black.



A rare period photo of a nearly forgotten Duesenberg lost to the wreckers. Originally owned by Marion Davies, this unique Model J with opera brougham (town car) coachwork by Rollston eventually had the rear of its body removed and was put to work as a truck. Someone spotted the rear of the body and reunited them to make the car whole again, but alas, it was eventually scrapped. The engine, J-411 (renumbered to J-568), was saved and it now powers a ca.-1932 Packard convertible coupe.



The original Model J design was dated by the mid 1930s, and to move the last of the Duesenbergs from the 1929 order of 500 chassis and engines, Rollston stepped in with a series of more modern bodies that had skirted fenders, higher beltlines and lower rocker sills. This series was called the JN, and 10 JNs were built: three sedans, four convertible coupes and three convertible sedans. This Rollston JN, likely pictured in California, is the only convertible sedan of the three that had its engine (J-571) supercharged. The Chicago branch of Duesenberg fitted the supercharger, and it did so with the very rare dual-carburetor setup. All three Rollston JN convertible sedans survive, this one remaining in the Bahre Collection in Maine (see page 46).



There were 25 convertible sedan bodies built for the Duesenberg Model J chassis by Pasadena, Calif., coachbuilder Walter M. Murphy Co. The wheel discs on this new-looking example of the most common Murphy convertible sedan style indicate the car may have been sold toward the end of Murphy's existence, which came in 1932. The Californian in this period photo appears rather melancholy considering he's sitting on a Duesenberg.

Two views, including a rarely seen rear view, of the Duesenberg Model J Murphy Beverly sedan owned by actress Lupe Velez and her husband, Olympic swimmer Johnny Weissmuller, who later played Tarzan in motion pictures. These photos show their Beverly, with engine J-449 in chassis 2462, after it was later fitted with skirted fenders to update its design. Despite caring enough for the car to have it updated, the acting duo's Duesenberg was scrapped by the end of World War II (their union was scrapped in 1939 through divorce). The 1937 California license plate in the top photo has an interesting frame with "Hollywood" engraved in it. The Duesenberg may be pictured here on a Hollywood back lot.

# Hidden since the 1960s, this Model J will return to Auburn in 2023 by angelo van bogart; photos by christin schultz

Believers say you should never reveal a wish, but don't try selling that superstition to Doug Pray of the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Co. Just 24 hours after telling his wife he hoped to find a "barn find" Duesenberg, his wish came true.

"The night before I got the phone call that it was for sale, my wife asked what I wanted to do in retirement," Pray recalled. "I said, 'I want to do the fun stuff: the buying and selling, the making deals.' She asked, 'What's the best deal you can find?'

"There has got to be another barn find Duesenberg Model J for sale in the United States," he replied, then immediately recanted. "Nah, it can't happen.' And it was the very next day it happened. You just don't get a phone call for a Murphy-bodied Duesenberg [barn find], and there will probably never be another one. I am very blessed

that I got the phone call."

If there's anyone who could possibly get an out-of-left-field phone call offering a million-dollar Duesenberg hidden from public view for 55 years, it's Doug Pray. Some might say such a call was long overdue. Pray's family has operated the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Co. in Broken Arrow, Okla., since 1960 — one year before this Duesenberg Murphy convertible coupe discovery was last publicly shown. It was Pray's father, Glenn, who purchased the company, along with its remaining inventory, from Dallas Winslow, who had bought it in 1938 from the original company.

In the 60-plus years he's been working at the family business, Pray only recalls one other Duesenberg at the shop.

"Since I was a little kid, the only Duesenberg I remember at the factory and we've had hundreds of Auburns and Cords since the 1960s — I remember the man who owned the Duesenberg 'Mormon Meteor' drove to the factory with the 'Mormon Meteor' on an open trailer, because the carburetor was bad. My dad rebuilt the carburetor, and Dad test drove the 'Mormon Meteor' down the street in front of our shop in the 1960s."

Now there's a second Model J Duesenberg at Auburn Cord Duesenberg Co., which Doug's son, Adam, now operates as a third-generation family business. And it's a very desirable Duesenberg.

The Model J is one of 50 Duesenbergs built with fabulous Murphy convertible coupe coachwork. Of those 50 Murphy convertible coupes, only 25 were optioned with the racy and desirable disappearing-top feature. The car was first sold in 1931 by Duesenberg's Philadelphia branch to Gene Gordon

Culver, founder in 1933 of *Esquire* magazine, then eventually made its way to Chicago, where Pray found it in late 2022.

It was Tom Hawkinson's daughter, Rebecca, who called Pray to say her father was ready to sell the Duesenberg that he bought for \$5,000 in 1961. The car still remained in the garage where her father had parked it and sealed it in 1967, never to see the sun until late 2022.

"I was at Hershey this last year, sitting there in a lawn chair under the tent, in the rain, and the company phone rang to my parts man's cell phone," Pray recalled. "He said [to the caller], 'Doug's tied up right now,' and then a couple minutes later, I heard him say to her, 'That is above my pay grade, let me have you talk to Doug Pray,' and this lady on the phone says she has a Duesenberg she may want to sell.

"Of course I am leery, because I get all of these calls all the time, but it's about an Auburn or a Cord, and I have never — we've had the factory for 63 years — and I have never had a call where somebody says, 'I have a Duesenberg for sale.' She said it belonged to her father since [1961], and she last rode in it as a teenager. People were chasing it and they were worried somebody was going to cheat him out of it [on the price], so they drove it into a one-car garage in 1967."

Pray said that they were the lucky ones to get approached about buying the car partly because the caller and her father had seen him on a TV show, and partly because the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Co. is a family operation.

"She said, 'My dad and I were watching an episode on "American Pickers" about you and your dad,' and her dad said, 'We have to trust somebody. I met Glenn Pray (Doug's father) years ago, and this is a father-and-son operation, and I was a father-and-son operation, and so I think you can trust Doug Pray,' and that day, she called my number."

Pray knew this was a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity, so he and his wife wasted no time in following up with an in-person visit of Rebecca and her family's Duesenberg.

"The next day, Saturday, I said to Jill, my wife, 'Let's text

her and see if we can stop by on the way home from Hershey,"
Pray said. "We can head home from Hershey in a lot of different directions and we can stop by and see the car."

The owner agreed on the short-notice visit.

"She said, 'I am so excited — I feel like we're going to meet a celebrity," Pray chuckled. "I said, 'Well, send us your address."

Pray and his wife arrived in Chicago still charged up about the potential Duesenberg find, despite the long drive from Hershey and a flat tire on the trailer they used to haul to the show an Auburn Speedster his company had restored. It was about 10:30 at night when they pulled up to the brick home in a Chicago neighborhood where the car was hidden, and he wasn't disappointed by what he found.

"They had already moved the furniture out of the house when Dad went in the nursing home, and the only piece of furniture in it was the kitchen table. And sitting on the table was a Duesenberg hood ornament, and I knew we were in the right place," Pray said.




Hidden in a Chicago garage since 1967, the Duesenberg was retrieved from its slumber in the fall of 2022.

In order to make the silver Duesenberg fit in the small, one-stall garage where it had been tucked, Hawkinson had plucked off the front and back bumpers. Once the bumpers were off, Hawkinson padlocked shut the garage's wood doors. Paint further sealed them.

Because the garage doors were sealed, Pray said the only way to access the tightly confined Duesenberg was through the door from the kitchen to the garage.

"The garage floor was literally 3 foot down with no step, and the rear of the car was touching the doors and the front of the car was touching the wall, and the driver's side was touching the wall. The passenger side of the car had 10 inches of room.

"You were looking down on top of a Murphy disappearing top Duesenberg J," he said.

Pray soon began examining the car's condition and opened the hood to look at the numbers — J-346 was stamped in the bell housing behind the red-painted engine, and 2365 was stamped in the firewall and frame. They all matched up to a Murphy convertible coupe, as they should have.

Hanging on the wall around the car were scattered parts — wheel discs, the bumpers — and resting on the rumble seat lid were the seat cushions reupholstered during the early 1950s in a green Naugahyde close in color to the proper apple green color that the engine should have been painted. Between the parts still attached to the car, and those resting atop it and hanging on the walls around it, the car was nearly complete.

Upon driving home after first viewing the car, Pray called Alan Atkinson,

a customer now based in Houston, Texas, who'd been buying parts from him for a 1928 Auburn Speedster over the last seven years.

"Over the next two weeks, Jill negotiated the deal," Pray said. He had admitted to Hawkinson that he probably could not afford it, but he would find a buyer to make sure the seller was paid top dollar for the car. That buyer was Atkinson, who grew up none too far from Broken Arrow in Winfield, Kan. Pray was also able to satisfy another stipulation for the owner.

"She wanted it to stay close to home," Pray said. "The car is staying in Tulsa, and we're going to restore it."

"I've always been scouting for barn finds, because I like the restoration challenge of bringing cars back to life," says Atkinson. "The possibility of finding an unrestored Model J Duesenberg never crossed my mind, because none exist—until Doug and Jill located this car."

Before the Prays' Auburn Cord Duesenberg Co. restores the car, Pray and Atkinson made plans to have some fun with it. They would reinstall the removed parts and carefully reawaken it in order to drive it in the annual Parade of Classics during the 2023 Auburn Cord Duesenberg Club Reunion in Auburn, Ind.

"This car was registered with the ACD Club back in 1956, so I really was the one who said we need to bring this car back and reintroduce it to the club and to the people that follow these cars and to the city of Auburn," Atkinson said. "It was a collaborative decision. I said, 'Doug, I really want you driving the car, not me as the owner. My dream would be to have to have you and Randy Ema in the seat... For me, it's not about the attention, it's about being part of the [restoration] process and making the decisions: What are we going to do and how are we going to do it?"


Atkinson and Pray also made plans to give the seller's daughter one more ride in it just as she remembers the car.

"I told her, 'We are going to get it running and you can ride in it again," Pray said. "It was so exciting to her that she would get to drive in it again."

### A Duesenberg goes to the factory

Once the Duesenberg arrived in Broken Arrow, Duesenberg expert Randy Ema flew in from California to verify and authenticate the car. The long-hidden Murphy convertible coupe was the

second-to-last of the remaining 378 Duesenberg Model Js of 481 built that Ema had not yet been able to personally inspect.

The immediate work at the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Co. included methodically rebuilding the brake system, cleaning the fuel system and a complete engine rebuild. It is the first Model J engine that the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Co. has rebuilt, and, after consulting with seasoned experts, Adam Pray doesn't expect it to be the last that their skilled of machinists and mechanics will rebuild.

"As a company, we have restored or rebuilt every engine that Lycoming has ever done," Adam said. "This will be the last one [from the company] for us. If Lycoming built an engine in the 1920s or '30s for an Auburn, Cord or Duesenberg, we will have rebuilt it. We are the original Auburn Cord Duesenberg Company, and this is extending our legacy."

As a continuation of the original factory, the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Co. has an extensive stock of new-old-stock (NOS) parts for those cars — 350,000 lbs. worth, Adam says — although he says most parts fit Auburns and Cords. In instances when the factory hasn't had a Model J engine part in stock, it has used its extensive network of suppliers to provide them.

"It takes 40 hours just to adjust the valves, so they're in the middle of that," Doug said a little more than a month before the ACD Club Reunion.

"These engines were designed as race engines and have some idiosyncracies you don't see on a Chevy engine," added Atkinson.

During the car's refurbishing in or around 1951, it was painted its current silver and upholstered in green. Presumably at that time, the engine was painted red, and to maintain its "as found" look and feel at the 2023 ACD Club Reunion, the 420-cid dual-overhead-cam engine was repainted red. When its concours-quality restoration resumes after the Labor Day club event, the straight-eight engine will be painted the correct apple green.

Work leading up to the ACD Club Reunion also included removing the fender skirting installed by Duesenberg in the 1930s, according to Pray.

"The fenders were originally unskirted," Pray said. "They are not finished — we have to put the bead back on the edge. We have the original fender shape back, and when the restoration is done, we will replicate the fender bead that was tucked under in 1935. [Atkinson], who bought the car from us, he wants the 1931 look, the way it was born, not the 1935 look.

"So at Auburn, you will see essentially what we found in that garage when we pulled it out," he added. "Same paint, same interior, same look, except for the fenders," he said. "Two instruments aren't original, but everything else is. We have both of the bumpers back on, and the steering wheel is on. It was off of it [when we found it], and the reason it was off was in case someone broke in to steal the car, they couldn't move it. We cleaned it up, but it's pretty much the way we found it."

Pray noted that they found the car to be pretty original while reinstalling its removed components and rebuilding its mechanical systems to make it drivable again.

"We even saved the original exhaust system," he said.

"The car is pretty darn original, but we didn't enter it in the preservation class [at the ACD Club Reunion], because the interior and paint were done in 1951.

"We are even going to leave the [old] tires on it. They were probably put on in 1960!"

"Because the car had been repainted and upholstered circa-1951, we did not believe this car was suitable to maintain as a survivor," Atkinson added. "The rarity, originality, history and 'verve' of this disappearing-top Murphy J convertible coupe mandates restoration to concours quality. After all, it was owned and driven by the founder of *Esquire* magazine!"

Atkinson wants to share his once-in-lifetime find by giving other enthusiasts at the ACD Club Reunion a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to touch and even sit in his Model J.

"I want people to say, 'I want to go to Auburn this year, because I want to have my picture taken with that car,' and if families want their kids to sit in the rumble seat, this is really a once-in-a lifetime opportunity to do that. To me, that's the spirit of this hobby." **OC**





### VanDerBrink offers muscle hoard on the block

RATHDRAM, Idaho\_ An incredible hoard of big-block Chevrolet cars and parts — mostly muscle car-era Chevelles, Camaros, Corvettes and El Caminos and parts from the collection of Roy Langlitz (aka "Rob Carter") — will come up for bid Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 16-17, at Langlitz's property in Rathdrum, Idaho, just outside of Spokane, Wash.

"Anyone who knows me knows I love Chevelles, and this auction's got plenty of them," said Yvette VanDerBrink, who's VanDerBrink Auctions firm is conducting the two-day event. ord automobiles flood the streets of Auburn, Ind., during the annual Auburn Cord Duesenberg Club Reunion and the city's coinciding ACD Festival over Labor Day weekend. But long before Auburns, Cords and Duesenbergs descend on the city each fall, visitors and residents alike can sometimes catch sight of an ACD car in motion within the "Home of the Classics." One of those Cords that can regularly be seen cruising Auburn is the 1937 812 Westchester sedan owned by local 53-year-old resident John Pontius.

"I use it here locally, mostly," said Pontius. "It's fairly reliable, but it's not reliable enough that I trust it to take it out of town. I am working on that. It's a work in progress."

The Cord is reliable enough that Pontius often drives it to work at Classic City Automotive, Inc., the NAPA parts store in Auburn that he owns.

It was through the parts store that Pontius came to discover the car in July 2021, and then get it back on the road.

"I kind of fell upon it," Pontius said. "I called Phil

[Allison] about an unrelated topic, because he's a customer of mine, and we had a 15-minute conversation, and at the end he said, 'By the way, if you know anyone that wants a Cord, I have one for sale.'

"It was a surprise — I didn't know about it. I didn't know it was in that barn, and I drive by it every day. I live about 1,000 yards from where this barn was."

The hidden car's presence was especially surprising to Pontius because he and his family are quite immersed in the city of Auburn. In addition to owning a parts store, he's a past president of the National Automobile and Truck Museum in Auburn, where his son, Jack, and daughter, Kennedy, regularly volunteer. Jack and Kennedy are enthusiasts themselves, and were even on the winning Great Race X-Cup Division team in 2023.

Pontius didn't quite immediately agree to buy the Cord, but after talking to Allison, he says he couldn't get the idea of buying it off his mind.

"It just kind of gets in the back of your head, and about three hours later, I called him back and said, 'I wish you hadn't told me about the Cord,' and after I went and looked at it, I bought it."

The Cord was not only local to Pontius, it was parked in a barn on property that once belonged to the man for whom it was named.

"I measured it off — [the barn] is about 200 feet from E.L. Cord's house, to the north. It would have been in an area that once was an orchard," Pontius said.


#### Cord builds the Cord automobile

After his success running the Auburn Automobile Co., E.L. Cord acquired Duesenberg Motors Co. in 1925, as well as other companies. By mid 1929, the Auburn Automobile Co. was ready to launch an entirely new automobile that would bear the Cord name. These cars would be designed by Alan H. Leamy (who also designed the grille, hood and fenders of the

Duesenberg Model J), and to its beautiful styling the new Cord would add innovative front-wheel-drive engineering, which also served to dramatically lower the car. The new Cord Front-Drive began production just a few months before the October 1929 Wall Street crash, and sales of all automobiles, including products from the Auburn Automobile Co., suffered following the economic downturn. The Cord Front-Drive was offered through 1932, then disappeared during that worst year of the Great Depression.

Down but not out, the Auburn Automobile Co. tried one more time at offering a front-wheel-drive Cord. Using what it had learned in the first generation of Cord automobile, for the 1936 model year the company developed a new front-wheel-drive chassis married to an equally innovative body of unitized construction. If its front-wheel-drive feature wasn't enough to gather headlines, the new Cord's styling certainly was. In-house designer Gordon Buehrig styled the new Cord using designs he had originally developed as a new "baby Duesen-

berg." With some refinements, he masterfully translated his "baby Duesenberg" to the smaller Cord chassis where it appears to have always belonged. Buehrig's utterly modern Cord design had a bold front wrapped in louvers, hidden headlamps and rounded pontoon fenders that cut a profile that mimicked the overall shape of the Cord sedan body itself. Being on a front-wheel-drive chassis, the Cord was lower than its rear-wheel-drive contemporaries, and by also tossing out running boards, Buehrig made it look even closer to the ground. The Cord was such a stylish and innovative car, decades later people could remember when they first saw one. Today, some of those people's children remember when their parents first saw a Cord!

Although the new 1936 Cord made its public debut in November 1935 and was enthusiastically perceived, sales were poor. There were issues getting the car to market, the front-wheel-drive transmission was not always trouble-free and people were questioning the viability of the Cord's parent company and its future ability to support vehicle repairs. After all, Americans had seen dozens of independent American car companies fall by the wayside during the lean years of the 1930s. As a result, there were only two model years of the second-generation Cord (the 810 of 1936 and the 812 of 1937). Once the last Cord 812 rolled off the assembly line in Connersville, Ind., during August 1937, the Auburn Automobile Co.'s chapter as a vehicle manufacturer had ended.

#### Barn find goes back on the road

There were many things about the 1937 Cord 812 Westchester sedan that excited Pontius. Being annually exposed to the fall car activities in Auburn, Pontius wasn't necessarily dazzled by the Cord name. He also owns the Auburn that his father, Lee, bought in 1977, so he'd already participated in the ACD Club Reunion and ACD Festival through the years. What really drew him to the car was its barn-find nature on property once owned by E.L. Cord, and that it had been owned since 1970 by three generations of his Auburn neighbors. And, as the owner of a parts store, he had the resources to get it back on the road.

Upon first seeing the dusty Cord and almost-immediately agreeing to buy it, Pontius told the seller that he wasn't in a rush to pick it up. Then he had a quick change of heart.

"After I told him I wasn't in a hurry, I said, 'There is only one issue — I got this 18-year-old kid who wants to get it out today."

The seller accommodated and Pontius brought the car home where he and his wife, Lorrie, and their children immediately began assessing the car's condition and cleaning it up.

"[It] was not too bad," Pontius said. "I think... it had a '70s-type restoration done to it and they just basically parked it."

During its earlier restoration, the car's color had been changed from its original Rich Maroon color to the factory Palm Beach Tan. Seat covers cloaked the original upholstery.

When Pontius and his son retrieved the Cord, it had not been run in decades, so over the course of two weeks, they squirted Marvel Mystery oil into the flathead V-8 engine's cylinders.

"We'd rotate the engine and 'squirt, squirt, squirt,' and it just took off. It sounded beautiful," Pontius said. "Then we worked on brakes and then the tranny came next. It was intimidating, but once you get it apart, it's kind of fun making it work."

Pontius said the forward-mounted, front-wheel-drive transmission didn't consistently function properly and did "weird things." Soon, he had it working, but only without the front cover in place.

"I would put it all together and put the cover on and it would not work," he recalled. "So I am laying in bed one night and thought, 'I bet that cover was rubbing something,' and sure enough, that cover was rubbing." Years of sitting also meant the brakes needed work, but Pontius didn't have to go far for the parts. He was able to source a master cylinder and wheel cylinders right through his own store.

"Now, on some of it, I had to do some creative thinking — it's not all stuff you can just order," he said. "For instance, I couldn't get one wheel cylinder, so I ordered two of the one side and took the guts out and put them in the other one. I had to rob parts to make it work correctly. The front wheel cylinders are a mirror image of each other and I couldn't get the one side, so I robbed the pistons and the rubbers out of one, honed the old wheel cylinder and installed the new parts."

Just two months later, Pontius and his family had the Cord going from barn to car show when they participated with it in the ACD Club Reunion.

"I purchased it in July of '21 and actually had it at ACD that year, so I had it ready for Labor Day," he said. "It wasn't perfect, but it drove there. It had square tires and the brakes weren't the greatest yet, but it made it there."

Since then, Pontius has slowly improved the car and regularly enjoys driving it to work and around Auburn.

"It is kind of fun," he said. "I never realized I would enjoy it that much. Watching that Bendix Electric Hand shifter work (the transmission), that's fun — when it works properly."

The Bendix Electric Hand shifter electrically assists shifting the transmission gears upon the demand of the driver. There is a lever mounted to the right of the Cord's steering column, and the driver selects the anticipated gear before changing gears. Once it's time to change gears while underway, the driver simple takes his foot off the accelerator, depresses the clutch, and *voila!*, the Cord is in the next gear to continue accelerating. While this sounds simple, the Electric Hand and the front-drive transmission were new innovations in 1936 and not without their troubles.

Now that Pontius has the transmission, Electric Hand and brakes dialed in, the Cord has become one of his go-to cars for fun during Auburn's summer months. Would he recommend daily driving a Cord to another enthusiast?

"If you're going to do the Cord experience, I think you should be somewhat mechanically inclined," he said. "Otherwise, you are going to have

to depend on other people to fix it, and that's going to get costly."

Long-term plans call for a restoration back to its original color, but in the meantime, Pontius plans on continuing to use it as a fun family driver. "I am going to use it as is, but when I get around to restoring it, I will make it maroon again — but that might be a retirement project." **OC**

## As usual, Mecum Tulsa has lots to like

TULSA, Okla. — Mecum Auctions held its 3rd Annual Tulsa Auction June 9-10 at the Sage Net Center at the fairgrounds. Originally scheduled as a three-day sale, the event was changed to two days, and both days were packed with vehicles. An estimated 600 cars crossed the block with active bidding.

There was a good crowd on Friday, and Saturday was almost standing-room only. Mecum gathered a wide selection of vehicles ranging from a 1931 Auburn to late-model muscle. Since the sale was being held in Oklahoma, it was also fitting that there was a great selection of trucks.

Late-model performance cars and resto-mods dominated the top 10 for Tulsa, with the top seller being a brand-new 2023 Dodge Charger King Daytona edition at \$181,500. Slots 2 through 4 were occupied by resto-mods: a 1969 Camaro (\$176,000), a 1959 Corvette (\$162,500) and a 1970 Dodge Challenger (\$159,500).

One interesting trend at the Tulsa auction was later-model cars that were already being "cloned." There were three fourth-generation GM F-body cars that were being sold with "optional equipment added." There was a 1995 Camaro that had been made to look like a 2002 35th anniversary SS, a 2002 Trans Am with a Firehawk hood and decals, as well as

another 2002 Trans Am with "added WS-6 equipment." Here are a few picks from the sale:

#### 1946 Chevrolet fire truck

OCW Price Guide Condition #3. Sold for \$16,500. This old firetruck definitely looked the part, and if you wanted something to have a ton of fun with at the next homecoming parade, this rig would be the ticket. The truck was advertised as having just over 17,000 miles, but had been repainted. Otherwise, it did appear that this was a highly original truck that had just had a re-spray job, and that was about it. Everything looked correct and there were no signs that the truck had been apart for a full restoration. The fire apparatus was included. The new owner is going to have a lot of fun with this old Chevrolet, and shouldn't have any trouble getting their money back when they are done with it.

#### 1971 Buick GS Stage 1

OCW Price Guide Condition #3. Sold for \$38,500. One of only 801 made, this 1971 Buick GS Stage 1 was a nicelooking car. It had an older, frame-off restoration that still presented well. Equipment included an automatic transmission backed by a 3.42 posi rear. It was a very unique Bitter-



Probably sold for a fair price for a 1995 Z28 convertible, however someone had spent a lot of time and money to make this car look like something it wasn't!

#### 1975 Oldsmobile 88 convertible

## Back to Beautiful



Duesenberg SJN returned to its original appearance


n the wake of the Great Depression, Duesenberg found itself with a problem. The economic catastrophe had a dampening effect on the sales of expensive, ostentatious cars. Many would-be Duesenberg owners chose something a little more down-to-earth in which to be chauffeured. It didn't do to be seen as profligate when the busiest shops in town were soup kitchens and bread lines. Consider that President Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt owned a Brewster town car — on a 1932 Plymouth chassis.

The public also perceived that Duesenberg was in shaky financial condition. It was. This perception was not helped by its showrooms, which rarely kept a car on the floor to display. Of course, Duesenbergs and cars of their class were often bespoke affairs. Customers ordered a chassis and had it sent to the coachbuilder of their choice for custom coachwork, whether entirely original or from a catalog of existing body designs. So there was no practical reason to have a standing inventory of complete and incredibly expensive cars. Duesenberg did have stylists who worked with coachbuilders, but the purchase process remained the same.

#### **Enter the JN**

In late 1934 or early 1935, Duesenberg management decided to order on spec a small run of more modern-looking bodies to mount on remaining Model J chassis. These bodies were kept at the ready

and marketed as ready-to-sell. The idea was to create an impression of greater financial stability, and to sell the last remaining Duesenberg chassis. (Starting in 1929, Duesenberg planned to sell 500 Model Js a year, but by the mid 1930s, it still had not sold all of the chassis and engines from its initial order of 500.)

Duesenberg stylist J. Herbert "Herb" Newport was enlisted to design this new run of bodies while Rollston of New York would build them. These cars are known as JNs (naturally aspirated) or SJNs (supercharged). Ten were built: Four cabriolets, three Berlines (sedans) and three convertible sedans. Of these, two JNs were supercharged, and only one was equipped with the dual-carburetor supercharger — this is that car, still fitted with engine J-571.

Newport and Rollston had a job cut out for them. The Duesenberg J chassis

upon which the JN bodies would be installed dated to the late 1920s. The chassis was constructed as sturdily as the Brooklyn Bridge and was almost as high-riding. By the mid-1930s, industrial design and consumer tastes had considerably evolved. Everything from locomotives to coffee percolators was being streamlined. Lower, smoother and faster looking was the order of the day. But designing a lower chassis for the JN was out of the question due to the cost, yet the JNs would have to appear up-to-date to be more saleable.

Behold J-571 (aka SJN-571) today, which still maintains the impression of sweeping grandeur and great elegance. Newport and Rollston skillfully combined the designer's eye and the coachbuilder's craft to imbue the body with a cohesive, streamlined appearance in keeping with the trends of the mid 1930s. There's no fussiness.

Brightwork is limited to a few punctuating details. The fenders are low and skirted, and the body is wider, which allows it to extend out and down over the chassis rails, enclosing them. In fact, the bottoms of the front doors are notched so that they may close over the frame. The observer's eye is naturally led from the front of the car to its tail by a body molding that begins on the hood, just behind the grille surround, and continues rearward and down to terminate at the bullet-like taillamps sourced from Chrysler Corp. The graceful, skirted rear fender echoes this line. Newport's original sketches depict the car with full wheel covers and blackwall tires, which give a lower appearance aided in no small part by its 17-inch-diameter wheels. Dark sienna brown paint and a tan interior and convertible top complete the car's subtle, sophisticated look.

#### **Changing appearances**

SJN-571's streamlining wasn't always appreciated. In the 1950s, when the collector car hobby as we know it today was in its infancy, attitudes towards styling and restoration were, at best, cavalier. At that time, after having passed through the hands of multiple owners, SJN-571 was in the possession of New Jersey furrier and enthusiast George S. Kudra. Feeling that the car should look more like a typical Duesenberg of the early '30s, he had it stripped of its wheel covers, chrome-plated its wire wheels and jettisoned the blackwall tires in favor of wide whites. A couple of unfortunate spotlights and cowl lamps were added, and a superfluous aluminum luggage rack was grafted onto the tail, cluttering the look of the car. A bluegrey paint scheme was applied to set off the gaudy jewelry. To Kudra's credit, he did have the engine rebuilt.


This was how the car looked when the late Bob Bahre acquired it from Kudra in 1980. Bahre was a self-made entrepreneur and a collector of rarified tastes possessed of an almost supernatural ability to winnow out cars before the rest of the world woke up to precisely what they were. Today, the convertible sedan still resides in The Bahre Collection situated on Paris Hill in Paris, Maine. I spoke with the collection's curator, Jeff Orwig, about Bob Bahre, SJN-571 and the process of returning it to its 1936 appearance.

Orwig explained that Bahre was "ahead of the curve" when it came to identifying extraordinary autos. He had a

great gift for "understanding people," and he relished "making the deal, even if it took decades." The result of his persistence is a collection of more than 60 rare and exquisite cars with an emphasis on coachbuilt Packards and Duesenbergs, ensuring SJN-571 is in the perfect home. SJN-571 is one of only 38 supercharged Duesenbergs, of which only five or six had this dual-carburetor setup.

It was long known that SJN-571 had been modified from its original appearance, and the sensitive job of setting things to rights was entrusted to Chris Charlton and the team at Classic Car Services of Oxford, Maine. Orwig says they gave it a "fantastic, sympathetic restoration." Responding to evidence gleaned from research and through the partial disassembly of the car, they learned that it was originally painted a rich dark brown. It was also apparent that much of the redoxide primer that Duesenberg used to paint chassis frames was still intact. "Rollston never painted the invisible sections of the chassis," according to Orwig, "much of the main frame rails are the original red-oxide Duesenberg primer."

After spending two and half years getting the car back to the way Rollston intended it to look, it was finished in March 2023 — in time to make a grand reentry into society at The Amelia concours, where it took best in the Duesenberg class. In Orwig's opinion, the judges were "smitten by the importance of the car and its startling transformation to what it was originally."

#### Riding in an SJN

Orwig and I wheeled the Duesy out into bright New England summer sunlight for photographs, and he gave me a little taste of what the most powerful American car of the prewar era was like on the road.

"It drives so easy," he says, and the three-speed manual transmission "shifts fine once it's warmed up." Although, admittedly, the shifts cannot be rushed, lest the gears gnash in protest before the 'box is warmed through. Of course, maneuvering the car on its 142.5-inch wheelbase is a challenge at a standstill, but it "steers easily" once on the move. Orwig says this twin-carb car is the easiest of the six Duesenberg Model Js in the collection to start from cold, but it still coughs in protest and stumbles

until settling into a smooth idle. There are faint rumblings which emanate from the supercharger. The engine is not demure, nor should it be; the single-carbureted supercharged Model J was rated in excess of 320 hp, and this Duesenberg has two carburetors!

Under acceleration, the gearbox emits a tuneful whine, and the big eight pulls well. Still, with around 5,500 pounds to contend with, even the twincarb supercharged engine dictates the convertible sedan gather speed rather than leap forward. Of course, it must be understood that in those days, a powerful car was one that could throttle down to a walking pace in top gear and pull cleanly away. Using 0-to-60-mph times as a yardstick to judge performance came after World War II.

"The true value of the supercharger is evident at highway speeds," Orwig reports.

The front footwells of the Rollston body are narrow, and on the passenger's side, heat-soak from the exhaust is apparent. But rolling over rough pavement, the feeling is one of great solidity; the leaf springs are just firm enough that the great car doesn't wallow, and there's not even a suggestion of rattling from the Rollston coachwork. Paris Hill is a place of Norman Rockwellian charm, complete with a village green and white-steepled church. Riding in the Duesenberg here, it was easy to mentally time-travel back to the 1930s and see the world through sepia-tinted glasses, marveling at the readouts from the car's comprehensive instruments, including an altimeter, all surrounded by a beautiful engine-turned panel.

Orwig broke my reverie, saying, "Slide that lever under your feet to the right." This bypasses the muffler completely, and the sound of 420 cubic inches is unleashed upon the world at full strength. When muffled in the "town" position, the tone of the Duesy's 32-valve engine could be likened to fine scotch – smooth and elegant. Unmuffled in "country" mode, it's pure moonshine, growling with menace under open throttle and delivering Mercedes AMGlike pops and burbles on the overrun. Intoxicating stuff. The joys of this "town and country" exhaust cannot be overstated and must be experienced.

Bob Bahre's foresight to collect and preserve fine cars and his family's continued dedication to the collection, along with Jeff Orwig's work as curator and the efforts of skilled restorers, have ensured that this devastatingly handsome Rollston convertible sedan again looks as its designers and builders intended. It also occasionally accrues real highway miles. As Orwig reports, "This is our tour car!"

#### Viewing The Bahre Collection

The Bahre Collection is not regularly open to the public. However, on the third Saturday of every July, the collection is open for tours as part of the Founder's Day celebrations. This is a charitable event to benefit the Bahre's next-door neighbor, the Hamlin Memorial Library and Museum, in Paris, Maine. For more information, visit www.hamlin.lib.me.us.

## The Endangered Sampan

treats that tourists looked forward to when visiting Hawaii was a ride in a sampan. Not any more. For starters, these jaunty, colorful peoplemovers were never very plentiful, and they apparently never strayed from the environs of Hilo, located on the Big Island of Hawaii.

While popular with tourists, sampans were gradually replaced by more modern and comfortable modes of public transportation, such as vans and buses. Today, only about a dozen sampans are known to survive, and many have been disbursed to other places. Three are known to be in Southern California.

#### **Building the sampan**

The sampan was born in the black-smith shops of Hilo to meet the city's need for mass transportation. Turning a Ford Model T or Model A sedan or coupe into a bus that could carry 10 or more passengers entailed removing the body aft the cowl and building a longer, open body with bench seats along the sides.

"Sampan" was the name previously given to small, flat-bottomed boats that provide personal transportation in the harbors and along the coasts of Southeast Asia. Since Japanese and Filipino residents of Hilo were the first to use



similar construction techniques to convert motor vehicles to ferry passengers around the city, they also adopted the sampan name.

A brochure promoting sampan rides said that, on days when a ship arrived, "there was a big demand for hired cars. It was such a sight to see all the drivers dressed in white shirts to greet the ship." Besides carrying tourists, sampans offered personalized door-to-door service to city residents.

After starting with Ford Ts and As, Hilo blacksmith shops that built sampan vehicles later turned to other

makes and models. Plymouths, Dodges and De Sotos became favorites, because of their sturdy chassis and drivetrain, and their reasonable prices as used cars. Some Chevrolets and others — even one 1953 Buick — were also converted into sampans.

#### Restoring a sampan body

Ken Yoshimura, who owns Ken's Auto Fender body shop in Hilo, backed into the sampan experience about 10 years ago when he bought the body of an old sampan that had once been mounted on a Dodge chassis and restored it.

Gordon Cline brought these sampans to California in the early 2000s. The conversions were based on an export model 1941 Dodge and a 1951 De Soto, which were both originally Plymouth bodies.

"The frame is hardwood, and it was in pretty good shape," he said of the body. The wood ribs are spaced two feet apart and rounded to the sampan's typical "bathtub" shape. The side and rear panels are formed from 10-gauge galvanized tin and attached to the frame.

The canopy that shades passengers is built like those of early station wagons on which longitudinal slats attach to horizontal ribs with padding added, all of which is then covered with grained vinyl. The roof mounts on four hardwood pillars, and vinyl and Plexiglas side curtains are provided "in case there's a change in the weather" (remember "Surrey with the Fringe on Top?").

Yoshimura saved the original structure and springs of the bench-style seats and reupholstered them with foam padding and tan vinyl. The original tubular hand rails were reattached.



The life-long bodyman found a 1948 Dodge, complete with six-cylinder engine and Fluid Drive, and restored the sheet metal and trim. He removed the doors and trunk lid, cut the roof at the A-pillar and removed the rest of the body. "Then the sampan body just slid into place and we bolted it down," he said.

The vehicle was finished in a twotone with tan and brown paint. Original

taillamps mount to the panel below the body, and Dodge bumpers, grille and trim complete the package.

Yoshimura occasionally drives his sampan and takes it to shows.

"I had 12 people riding in it for one parade," he remarked, "Many people who see it tell me they had ridden in one" back when they were plying the streets of Hilo.



#### Sampans that left the island

Charles Furman, owner of a 1950 De Soto Sampan that he has restored, related that the vehicles ran on the Big Island of Hawaii until 1976, when transportation service had transitioned to air-conditioned vans. In 1994, Furman said, "the Hilo Sampan Bus Company tried to make a comeback with five restored sampans carrying tourists and locals around Hilo."

Hilo Sampans provided that experience until 1999, when its five sampans were purchased at auction by the National Tropical Botanical Garden (NTBG) and were put into service transporting small groups of visitors into the south shore gardens on Kauai, and to promote the attraction in the annual local parade.


California resident Gordon Cline, who was influential in establishing the Hilo sampan connection with the mainland, saw the sampans when he visited the botanical gar-

dens. A few months later, when the NTBG offered the vehicles for sale, he bought a 1941 Dodge and, a year later, a 1951 De Soto. He shipped them to California and later sold the Dodge to two fellow National Woodie Club members.

Cline restored the 1951 De Soto sampan and sold it some years later. Unlike Furman's 1950 De Soto, which began life as a U.S. production sedan, Cline's sampan was built from a 1951 Plymouth body with a De Soto grille and trim that was manufactured in Canada and exported to Hawaii before the islands became a state.

The sampan Cline sold to Mick Carolan and Jim Cocores also originated as a 1941 Plymouth export model titled as a Dodge when it arrived on the Hawaiian shore. Sometime later, it was converted to a sampan and eventually wound up in the NTBG fleet. Cocores and Carolan have restored it and attend shows and parades with it in Southern California. **OC**







## Speaking of Hot Rods with KEN GROSS

## Flames and Pipes at Greenwich

raditionally, East Coast rod and custom enthusiasts have headed to York, Pa., during the first weekend of June for the National Street Rod Association's popular "East Coast Nats." But there's an alternative. The Greenwich (Conn.) Concours d'Elegance is in its 28th year. A two-day show, with a Saturday focus on sports cars and the Sunday spotlight on exotics and Classics, Greenwich takes place in a lovely harbor-side park adjacent to a posh, little eponymous village.

#### From Carini's corral

For the last few years, amidst a wide array of show cars, Greenwich has presented several serious hot rod displays. Last year, it featured the "Rolling Bones." This year, the event's Grand Marshal, Wayne Carini, brought several cars. There was a small but red-hot class of flamed "On Fire" rods and customs, and Ross Myers and his crew displayed six stellar historic hot rods from the 3Dog Garage Museum in Boyertown, Pa.

Representing Wayne Carini's 100-plus car collection, there was a '32 Ford five-window by Steve Moal that was originally built for Bonneville record-holder George Poteet. This sharp coupe sported an elegantly shaped grille that was reminiscent

Built by Dick Williams of Berkeley, Calif., this baby-blue T won the coveted America's Most Beautiful Roadster (AMBR) award in 1953. It's likely the first hot rod with a hand-built, chrome-moly tubular chassis. The 286-cid Mercury flathead had Belond "W-Type" headers, four Strombergs on an Edelbrock manifold, Kong igntion and Navarro finned heads. Kinmont disc brakes on all four corners, a "suicide" front end and a Halibrand quick-change rear were all the right stuff.

of a 1930s Miller racing car. It's hard to improve on the classic Deuce grille shell, but Moal makes a good argument.

Carini's '36 Ford was to die for, and he drove it on the Greenwich Tour on Friday. Carini is a pretty ecumenical car guy; he likes them all, from brass to special-interest, but he has a special spot for hot rods, and Steve Moal built a one-off roadster for him a few years back that's also appeared on the lawn at Greenwich.

#### Rods and customs 'On Fire'

Two of the top cars in the "On Fire" flames class were Jeff Goldstein's ex-Sam Hollingsworth tribute '57 Chevrolet Nomad and Charlie Padula's '34 Ford three-window. The original Nomad was built in 1963 and fitted with a Corvette V-8, Buick Skylark wires and '64 Impala bucket seats. The end-to-end hot licks were done by Dennis Ricklefs, and back in the day the car starred on the cover of the May 1967 *Rod & Custom*. As well, it was a Revell plastic model (but you had to duplicate the flames — there were no decals). Sadly, that original car was lost to time, but in 2010, Richard Graves built this exact replica with Sam Hollingsworth on board as part of the build team. Dennis Ricklefs again painted the racy flames, and it was featured on a September 2010 cover for *Rod & Custom*, followed by another cover on *The Rodder's Journal*.

#### Myers' historic hot rods

The six historic cars from Ross Myers' collection were a big attraction. Ross is the consummate car collector — his father was a car enthusiast, and Ross' interest began when he was a child (he grew up with everything from Model T Fords to Classic Pierce-Arrows, and he still has his dad's Pierce-Arrow coupe). Over the years, he's acquired a Duesenberg, a Thomas Flyer, a slew of racing cars with a focus on Carroll Shelby, Holman & Moody and the Trans-Am Series, along with numerous Porsches and Cobras. Ross especially loves vintage racing and is a regular at the Monterey Historics.

It's not often that an enthusiast owns both Duesenbergs and Deuces, but Myers is the exception. He especially likes hot rods with interesting stories and famous owners/builders. He and his lovely wife Beth were on hand for this year's concours. Their cars were on display both on Saturday and Sunday.

In no particular order, here they are:

#### 'The Avenger'

Don Tognotti was a successful Sacramento, Calif., businessman who owned a chain of custom auto-parts stores. He built a copper-hued five-window coupe in 1960 and called it "The Avenger." A consistent winner at rod and custom shows in California at the time, it was wedge-channeled, which gave it a unique raked stance that is one of its trademarks. It's powered by a 331-cid 1951 Chrysler Hemi V-8 with '53 Chrysler heads. Its radical custom exhaust headers were so cool they became a constant topic of conversation by all who saw them or who wrote about the car in contemporary hot rod and custom maga-

zines. Its sheer audacity still makes "The Avenger" a topic of conversation nearly 60 years after its creation.

#### 'Titus '32'

Built in the late 1950s by Lee Titus, who owned a speed shop in Culver City, Calif., this black Deuce roadster starred on the May 1959 cover of *Hot Rod Magazine*. Full-fendered and finished in black lacquer with a red interior, and powered by a fuel-injected Corvette V-8, it was pure California. Hot rod photographer Andy Southard was the car's next owner. It was the subject of a multi-part feature in *Rod Action Magazine* when Dick "Magoo" Megugorac removed the fenders and made it a highboy. Subsequent owners included Jim Busby, Bruce Meyer, Bill Hammerstein and Andy Cohen. The roadster was recently restored to its 1959 *Hot Rod Magazine* cover configuration by

Roy Brizio of South San Francisco, and it won the coveted Dean Bachelor Award at Pebble Beach in 2022.

#### 'The Kookie Car'

People still flock around "The Kookie Car," a flamed, raked and bobbed 1922 Ford roadster pickup that starred in the TV Series "77 Sunset Strip" with Edd "Kookie" Byrnes as a jive-talking car jockey (parking valet). It was built by Norm Grabowski from Sunland, Calif., who was a part-time "B-movie" actor, and the car starred on the covers of *Hot Rod Magazine*, *Car Craft* and many other monthlies. Ross Myers says he watched every episode of that popular show and was delighted when the car came up for sale. But there was a catch.

The once-iconic 'Kookie Car' roadster had been totally transformed by a previous owner with ugly dual headlamps, dual blowers and even dual rear wheels. Fortunately, all the original parts had been saved. Roy Brizio's South San Francisco shop restored "Kookie" to it's '50s TV configuration, even leaving the crude chassis welds, "because that's how Norm built it." It won the Pebble Beach Historic *Hot Rod* Cover Car Class in 2019.

"The Kookie Car has to be the wildest-looking machine that's ever been to Pebble Beach," says Brizio. "Even more importantly, if you mentioned the 'Kookie Car' to anybody, they knew about it. Even people in their 60s would share their memories of Edd Byrnes, Dino's Lodge and '77 Sunset Strip.' It was amazing.

"It meant something special to Ross, because he had watched '77 Sunset Strip' as a kid and he especially liked when car jockey Edd Byrnes would jump over the side into the wild little T," Brizio added.

"I was going to buy that car," Myers said. "Looking back, I probably spent too much on it, but I really wanted it." You've got to love that attitude.

#### 'The Mack T'

Understated and almost unnoticed, the snappy black 1927 Ford Model T roadster on the Greenwich lawn was built by Frank Mack in Farmington, Mich., and it starred at the first Detroit Autorama in 1953. Beautifully proportioned and flathead-powered, Mack drove it on the street, and with its snug top, he even took it out in the Detroit winter weather! That sleek track nose was incredibly made from two '41 Chevy fenders, and there's a full belly pan underneath. Its wonderful patina and still-lustrous black lacquer attests to the fact that this car is totally original and has never been restored.

Unusual for a Midwest hot rod, the Mack T was featured in *Hot Rod Magazine* in the early 1950s. Mack did the work himself with no aftermarket parts. That's when hot rodders had to be metal men and mechanics, and Mack was both. Historic rodding enthusiast Bruce Meyer owned this car in Beverly Hills for a while, but he was too tall to drive it. Myers commented, "That's the one thing we short guys have over the tall guys — we fit in channeled cars." Myers says he has no plans to change anything on this Midwest hot rodding time warp.

#### 'Wetzel-Valley Customs Deuce'

Famed builders Clay Jensen and Neil Emory, from the Valley Custom Shop in Burbank, Calif., were best known for sectioned custom cars such as the famed Jack Stewart Olds Holiday 88 coupe called "The Polynesian." They didn't do many hot rods, but when they did, iconic cars such as the Dick Flint roadster and this sharp yellow Deuce afforded them lasting fame. Valley Custom Shop was one of the most influential shops in the 1950s and many of their cars have survived.

Jensen and Emory built this channeled '32 Ford with a racy DuVall windshield for Dr. Leland Wetzel, who picked up his new, professionally built hot rod at the shop in Burbank, drove it to Bonneville for his honeymoon and then on to his home in Springfield, Mo. It was owned for years by Kurt McCormick, a Missouri-based Barris Kustom enthusiast, and he installed a blown Cadillac V-8. Thankfully, Myers had Brizio track down the original flathead V-8 and re-install it. (By the way, Neil Emory was Porsche Outlaw creator Rod Emory's grandfather).

#### '1953 AMBR winner'

First owned by Dick Williams of Berkeley, Calif., this handsome powder-blue T won the coveted America's Most Beautiful Roadster (AMBR) award in 1953. It's likely the first hot rod with a hand-built, chrome-moly tubular chassis. State of the art for its day, it packed a lusty 286-cid Mercury flathead with Belond "W-Type" headers, four Stromberg carburetors on an Edelbrock manifold and Navarro high-compression heads. Williams built his own Kong-style distributor with twin Echlin ignition coils.

The tubular chassis — arguably a first on a hot rod — featured rare Kin-


mont disc brakes on all four corners, a "suicide" front end and a Halibrand quick-change rear. Twin cross-fed 9.5-gallon fuel tanks were mounted under the car. I saw this car in *Hop Up* magazine in the '50s and was mesmerized by the Kinmont disc brakes. After many years, I found a set for my own '32 roadster.

Hall's Top Shop in Oakland stitched the rolled-and-pleated black leatherette upholstery. Nine Stewart-Warner instruments, a Bell Auto Parts three-spoke steering wheel, Frenched '46 Ford taillamps, a full belly pan, a rolled rear pan and chromed reversed wheels with '50 Mercury caps were just a few of the car's many features. Everything was buffed and chrome-plated — even the oil pan.

"I heard about this car years ago from (noted Pennsylvania hot rod builder) Jim Cherry," Myers says. "It was always one of his favorites. For its time, with all the modifications, that AMBR win, and 123-mph Bonneville racing history, it was remarkable."

#### Hot rods to return

That was Greenwich this year, from a hot rod perspective. I'm tasked with assembling another stellar group of rods and customs next year. No hints. You'll just have to come to Greenwich to see them. **OC** 



The original ex-Sam Hollingsworth '57 Chevrolet Nomad was built in 1963 and fitted with a Corvette V-8, Buick Skylark wires and '64 Impala bucket seats. The end-to-end hot licks were done by Dennis Ricklefs and the car starred on a May 1967 *Rod & Custom* cover. It was a Revell plastic model (but you had to duplicate the flames – there were no decals). That original car was lost to time. In 2010, Richard Graves built this exact replica, with Sam Hollingsworth as part of the build team.
