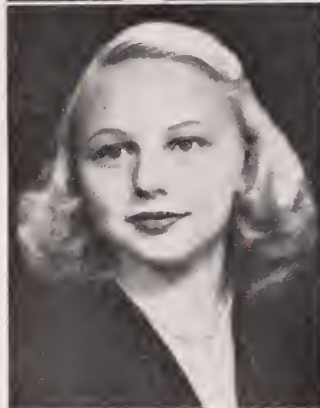

THESE juniors entered P. H. S. as freshmen three years ago. They've worked long and hard, but in spite of all this they remain in our memories as the "Jolly Juniors."

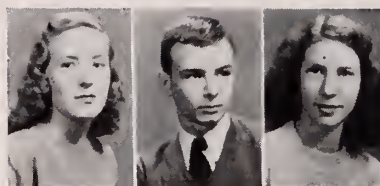
The juniors have entered the social life of P. H. S. and have been very active in clubs. In December they gave a Junior Prom, which was a great success.

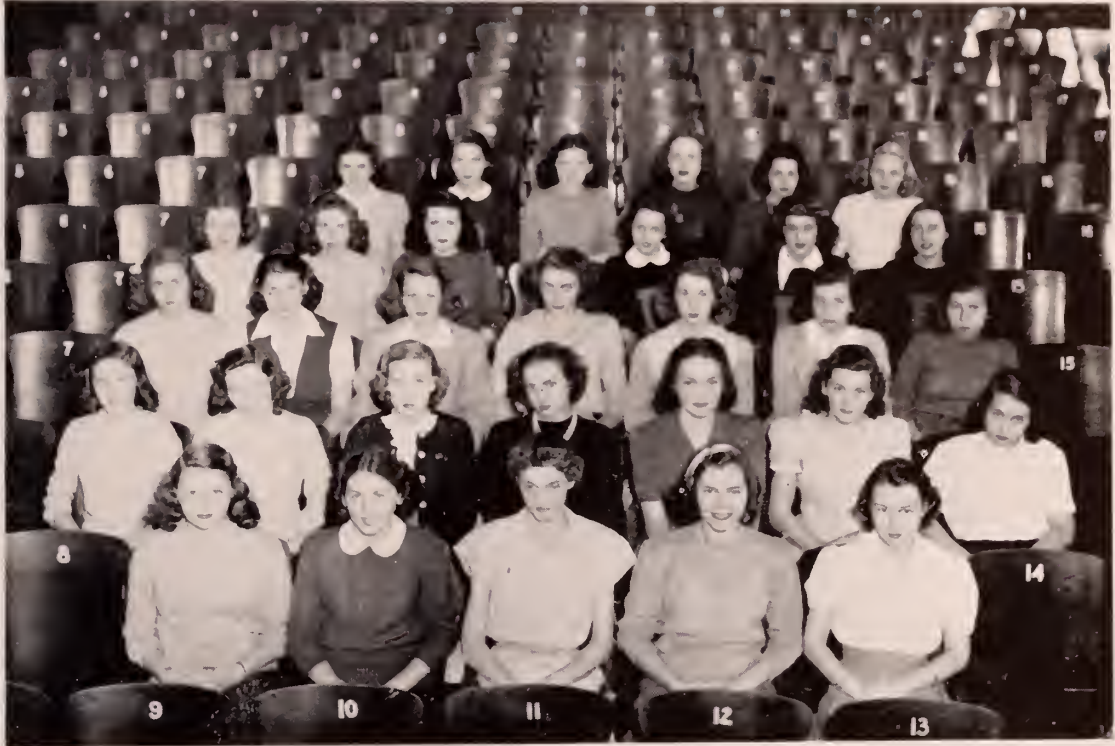
THE Boys' Hi-Y is the only club in school that stands for Christian character and fellowship.

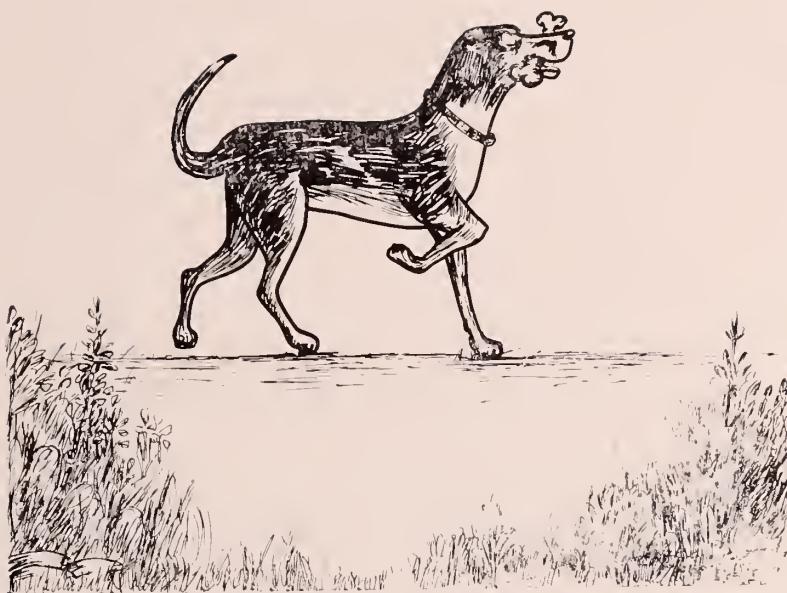

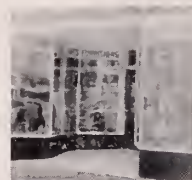
