THE Student Council began its work early in the school year.

The most important aims and purposes of the council are: To provide a means for student participation in school government by writing the efforts of the Faculty and student body; and to promote the general welfare of the school. Classes were invited to "sit in" on Council meetings. This proved very beneficial.

The activities which they sponsored were: The Farmer's Ball, which is an annual affair; four performances of the Vaudeville Show were given in February; a dance was given for the benefit of the Band and Chorus. The Council also furnishes the amplifying system to be used for dances and other purposes.

One of the most important projects which the Council undertook this year was that of buying new posts to be placed in front of the school. A general clean-up campaign was conducted in the month of March.

The president of the Council, Al Hamilton, and vice-president, Jack Minnick, were elected by the student body. The secretary, Doris Mabe, and the treasurer, Jean Jenkins, were elected by the Council, which consists of the different club officers and the four class representations. Mrs. Sunbeam Farris was chosen sponsor.

## Football..

August 25, 1948, saw Head Coach Vic Kreiter and his assistant, Bill Plant, open a new regime in the annals of Pulaski High Athletics. Eight lettermen formed the nucleus of the football squad. After three weeks of hard work the Orioles opened their season September 17th at Christiansburg and were duly rewarded with a 12-6 victory over the Demons.

The following week, the Birdmen took on a highly touted Martinsville eleven at Calfee Park. The Martinsville football machine roared to a decisive 40 to 6 victory. Pulaski's lone touchdown came in the final period when Mark Ferguson took a pass on the end zone from Dean Carper. The Bulldogs were just too powerful and had too much talent for the Orioles to combat.

Playing the favored Indians from Blacksburg, the injury-riddled Pulaski eleven lost a heartbreaker in the final period, 13-7. After a nip and tuck battle the half ended with the Orange and Black leading by one point, 7-6. Carper scored the T. D. and passed to Mark Ferguson for the extra point. That one point looked big enough for a victory until the waning minutes of the ball game when the Indians crossed the double strip to spell defeat for the Orioles.

The next Friday the Radford High Bobcats invaded Calfee Park to hand the home town boys their third straight setback. Playing an inspired game, the Orioles did everything but defeat the Bobcats by outplaying them, both on offense and defense. Doug Divers was the outstanding back on the field as he broke loose several times for long gains. The entire line outplayed the opposition as did the backs with their hard running blocking and tackling. It was another heart-breaking defeat with Radford edging Pulaski 12 to 7.

The Orioles hit their winning ways by thoroughly trouncing the favored Narrows Green Wave 19 to 6. The home town folks saw the Orioles finally mustering their ground gains with the aerial attack to put on the best show of their campaign. All the scoring was done by the ends, as Buddy Wirt scored twice and Mark Ferguson once and also kicked the only extra point of the game. It was the case of the team being "up" for the contest and knocked Narrows out of the running for District honors.

Traveling to Fleming, the Orioles found the going tough by coming up on the short end of a 12-0 count. The Birdmen couldn't get rolling and never could find the power for a scoring drive.

Back at home on the following week end, Pulaski and Dublin locked horns in what was probably the best played game of the year.

Pulaski gained first blood when little Ezra Quesenberry scored. Ferguson booted the point and Pulaski led 7-0.

The Dublin team came to life minutes later





Mud and water hampered the hard-charging lines and the running of the backs, thus slowing both teams and keeping the score down.

To close out the season, the Orioles traveled to Wytheville to meet the highly-talented Maroons. From the first whistle to the end of the game, Pulaski put up a valiant fight, but were overpowered by the Wytheville machine which rolled over the Orioles 41-0.

Along the line Pulaski held a slight edge in the line play all through the game but the Oriole pass-defense was caught napping time after time as the Maroons rolled to a decisive victory.


