We are not unmindful of all those who have in any way contributed to our publication. Without your interest and aid our work would have increased in volume. May we deserve the help you rendered us.

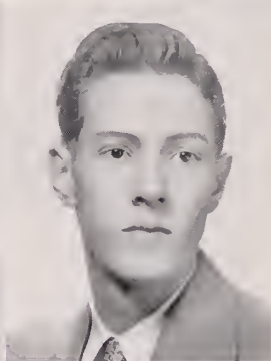
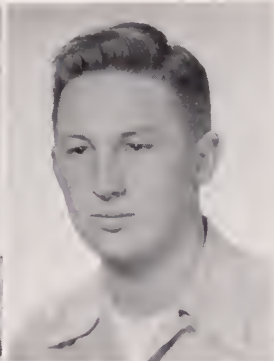
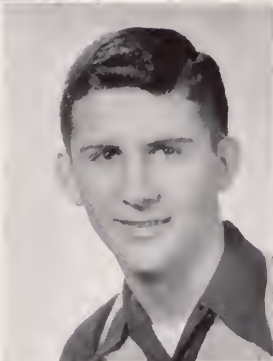

The Student Council is the organization which helps to direct school activities.

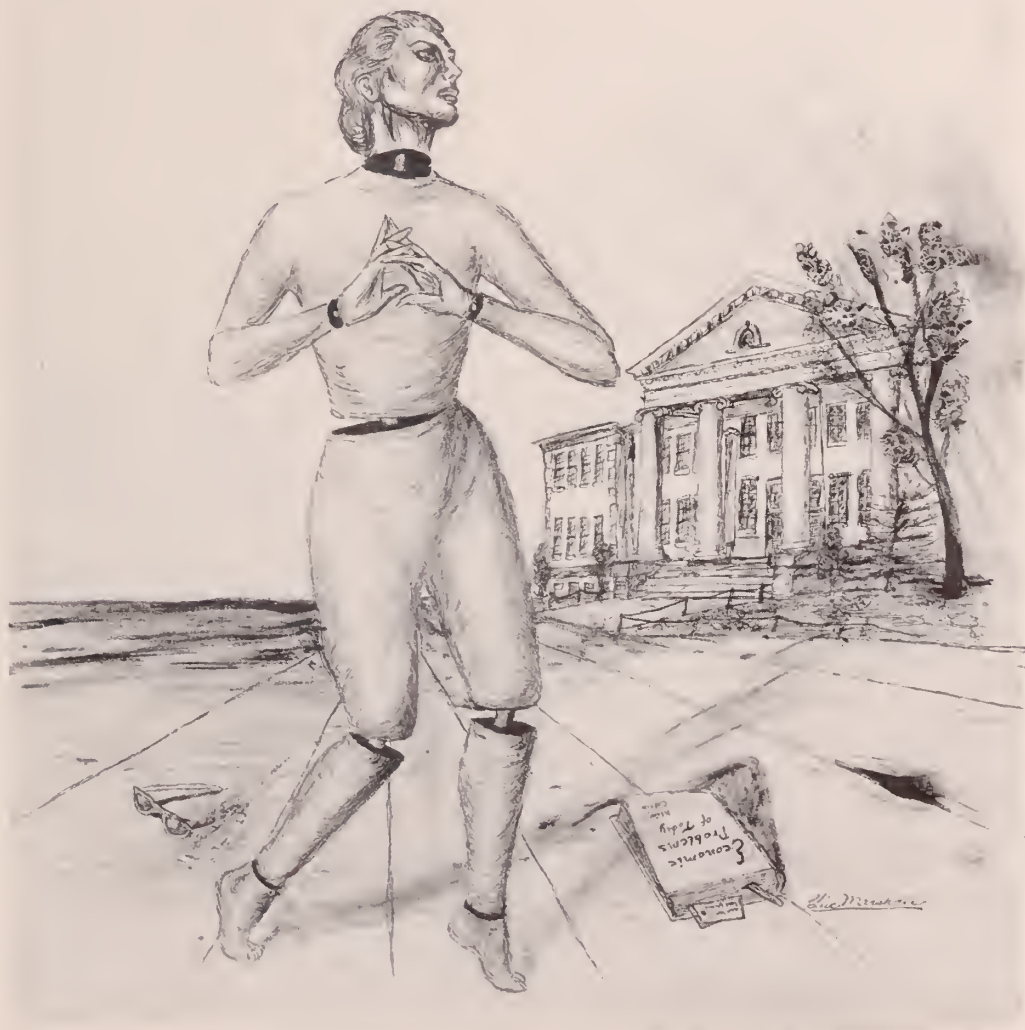
The students are represented by presidents of the classes and clubs and by elected representatives from the sixth and seventh grades.
