The 300 mile long St. Johns River is the longest river in Florida. From its source near Lake Okechobee, it runs northward parallel to the east coast and empties into the Atlantic Ocean at Jacksonville. The northern section of the river between Astor and Palatka is known as the "Bass Capital of the World". However, bass fishing is excellent along the entire length of the river. Much of the river is unspoiled, lined with thick foliage, and there is an abundance of animal and bird life. Scheduled river tours are available as well as houseboat rentals, which enable the tourist to cruise at his own pace. The districts from Sanford to Jacksonville are marked with "1" to indicate the river is wide-channel as you proceed. The "Gentle Current" moniker, an endangered species, are visible at Blue Springs State Park in Orange City during the winter months, as water temperature remains at 70 degrees F. Their greatest enemy is a speeding motorboat, as they are very slow swimmers. Boaters should observe the slow speed warning signs at the approach to Blue Springs.
