

## RECREATION MAP FOR FISHING, RAFTING AND CANOEING

This map details a section of the 436 mile Chattahoochee River which originates in the northern mountains of Georgia, near Helen. Continuing through lakes, cities, towns and open country, the river travels to southern Georgia, where it joins the Flint River to form the Apalachicola River, which then flows on to the Gulf of Mexico.

The area is home to a vast variety of birds and animals such as beaver, muskrat, fox and raccoon. There is an abundance of plant life which can be enjoyed throughout the seasons. The Chattahoochee River National Recreation Area preserves the natural beauty and rich history of the area for continued enjoyment by all.

Unicoi State Park, two miles north of Helen, Ga., is located amidst the secluded and rugged beauty of mountain wilderness. The park surrounds Unicoi Lake, offering tent and trailer camping, cottage rentals, a 100 room lodge, conference center and restaurant. Picnic areas, swimming beaches, canoes and paddle boats are available - fishing is permitted from the lake banks and in the surrounding streams, subject to state laws. Adjoining Unicoi State Park to the north is spectacular Anna Ruby Falls.

The cultural history of the area reflects Cherokee Indian territory, and reminders of the Indians' appreciation of nature; - Chattahoochee means "River of the Painted Rocks".

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
