The prudent mariner will not rely solely on any single aid to navigation, particularly on floating aids. See U.S. Coast Guard Light List and U.S. Coast Pilot for details.

Do not put waterproof charts away wet and folded. Do not store in direct sunlight or at temperatures above 120°F. for long periods of time.

DIST

The Waterway is indicated by a red line. Mileage distances along the Waterway are in Statute Miles, southward from Norfolk, Virginia. Tables for converting Statute Miles to International Nautical Miles are given in U.S. Coast Pilot 4.

RADAR REFLECTORS

RULES OF THE ROAD
U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE

Motorless craft have the right-of-way in almost all cases. Sailing vessels and motorboats less than sixty-five feet length, shall not hamper, in a narrow channel, the safe passage of a vessel which can navigate only in that channel.

When motorboats approach each other at right angles obliquely, the boat on the right has the right-of-way in most cases.

Motorboats must keep to the right in narrow channels, where safe and practicable.

Mariners are urged to become familiar with the complete text of the Rules of the Road in U. S. Coast Guard publication "Navigation Rules for Power-Driven Vessels."
